In the afternoon, Foundation and Key Stage I had an assembly with Anna and her friend H2O. She told them what we need water for and how we can help save water. We also took delivery of our own waterbutt that we can collect water in to use in our garden.





## Term Two Thursday Clubs

#### Round-Up!



During Term Two, pupils were given a choice to attend 3 clubs out of 5. The clubs on offer were Circuits, Computer Club, Drama Club, Sewing Club and Board Games Club.

In **Circuits Club**, the pupils exercised all of their muscles in a range of fun circuit activities such as squats, tricep dips and press-ups. The pupils even had the opportunity to create their own circuit activities. Well done to all the athletes! During **Computer Club**, the pupils were introduced to the BBC Micro: Bit, a mini computer which could be coded to respond to various inputs. The pupils were able to develop their coding skills using Microsoft Make Space in order to create a name badge, a beating heart, an emotions badge, a step counter, a night light and a rock-paper-scissors game.

In **Drama Club**, the pupils developed their listening and voice production skills through a range of drama games and they worked collaboratively to perform a play about climate change. The pupils talked about staging, costumes and developed their dramatic performances.

During the **Sewing Club** sessions, the pupils all enjoyed developing their sewing skills in order to create some felt fruit creations.

The **Board Game Club** pupils developed skills such as strategy and problem-solving when playing a range of table top and card games, many of which were new games for the pupils. They had lots of fun, enjoyed learning new skills and were delighted to be able to play these games with new friends.

Term Three's clubs are already underway and we look forward to seeing our pupils developing some new skills during their next set of clubs.

## Every School Day Counts

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	Excellent
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence I Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Satisfactory
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Poor
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Very Poor
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Unacceptable
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and I Day of Learning Missed	Unacceptable

For some parents, 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half of a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly 4 school weeks.
