
If you have changed your address, mobile number or any other contact information please inform the school as soon as possible, to keep records up to date. This is important for all pupils, Nursery to Primary 7.

Water Bottles

Nursery to Primary 7 and the cut off time for entry is 8:35am to allow pupils time to eat their breakfast before moving on to their classroom.

Just a quick reminder that all pupils (Primary I to Primary 7) should now have their own "School Water Bottles" which

have been marked clearly with their name. Rather than paying for water on a monthly basis, pupils can now bring their own personalised bottles with them to school each day. Please note, these bottles should be filled at home with water only. If required these can be refilled at school (this will be tap water only!). If for any reason your child requires another water bottle, these can be purchased from the school office at a cost of $\pounds 2.50$.

Could I please again request that when organising your child for the week ahead at school, you complete the money slips provided and send the exact amount required, if you are aware of the plans for the week ahead (regarding dinner money and extended school's money). Please where possible send all monies on a Monday morning.

As you are aware unfortunately, in these uncertain times we have been seeing a lot of absences from school. If your child is ill, please telephone the school office to advise us of your child's absence and of the cause. When your child returns to school you can send a note into school on their first day back or send an email to the Principal (jlogan.335@c.2kni.net) to confirm why your child has not been attending school The reason for this is to ensure the correct codes are applied in relation to your child's absence.

In addition to this I must make you aware that if your child has to leave school throughout the day to attend an appointment, under COVID-19 guidance, they will be unable to return to school again that day. I would therefore ask that when possible any appointments are made outside of school hours.

Finally, if your child's absence is related to COVID you **must inform the school immediately** to allow proper procedures to be followed! This is extremely important should other pupils have to isolate as a result.

Every School Day Counts

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	Excellent
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence I Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Satisfactory
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Poor
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Very Poor
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Unacceptable
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and I Day of Learning Missed	Unacceptable

For some parents, 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half of a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly 4 school weeks.

Give your child the best start in life – every school day counts!

Admissions to Nursery & Primary School

If your child is starting pre-school or primary school in September 2021, you can apply for their place online from **Thursday 7th January 2021 at 12:00noon.**

The closing date and time for pre-school and primary one applications will be 12.00 noon on 29th January 2021.

Further information on the admissions procedure will be available in the coming weeks as it is made available to us.

Pre-school places are available for children who are in the target age group, i.e. who were born on or between 2nd July 2017 and 1st July 2018.

All children born on or between 2nd July 2016 and 1st July 2017 must begin their primary education from September 2020 because by that date they will have reached **COMPULSORY SCHOOL AGE**.

Important Reminder

Can I please remind everyone of the following safety issues when dropping off / collecting your children from school:

- Cars should not (at any time) be driving into the school grounds to drop off or collect pupils (if you feel this is something you have to do (possibly for health reasons) then I would ask that you speak to me and I am sure we can come to some agreement)
- Please remember that the wearing of Face Coverings is strongly encouraged especially when inside our school grounds!!
- Sadly, over the past few weeks a number of pupils are not being collected promptly at the end of the school day! Can I remind you that although school finishes for your child at 1:50pm or 3:00pm, the day is not over for staff who may be covering afternoon classes, going straight into meetings or have further work to complete prior to the next day! Unfortunately, if pupils are not collected promptly (and to avoid a lot of time being spent trying to contact parents) they will be sent to After-Schools where the normal fee of £2.00 will be charged. Please please be assured that all pupils will be looked after until they are collected although sadly to avoid constant late collections I have had to make this decision!
- A quick reminder that schools finishes early for <u>all</u> <u>pupils</u> (Primary I to Primary 7) at 2:00pm <u>every Friday</u>
- Finally, can I remind you that once pupils are collected from their classes they are your responsibility! Unfortunately, in the afternoon a number of our younger pupils are running around 'unsupervised' as they wait for their older siblings. This is happening

outside the 'Surestart' area next to the driveway and also at the P4/5 entry and exit doors. Please do be vigilant around these areas as accidents at the end of the school day are not what we want to see
