Friday 1st December officially marked the 60th day of school and for all pupils at Bushmills Primary School the number '60' this academic year holds a much greater significance as we celebrate 60 years of our school (at our current site).

Staff and pupils took this day to mark the beginning of a range of celebrations which will take place throughout 2017-2018.

A wide range of events got underway not only on the day but also many Literacy, Numeracy, ICT and Art activities were completed in class throughout the week in preparation for this event.

These included pupils putting together a wall display which explained '60 Reasons Why Our School is a Diamond', each class making a large Birthday Card in which they all included a picture of what they like doing in school, ICT research where KS2 pupils created posters showing 'how to say the number '60' in different languages' as well as each pupil having their photograph taken with an 'ageing booth' just to find out what they might look like when they reach 60.

The week concluded with a party on the Friday when all classes took part in a range of '60 second fitness challenges', played 'Pass the Parcel', which of course had a sixties theme and also created a specially themed '60' artwork in the school assembly hall using Ip and 2p coins which they had been collecting prior to the main event (All coins were counted at the end and an amazing £140.40 had been collected which has now been set aside for the school's chosen charity this year which is Autism N.I.)
