WELCOME BACK !


With half term over I know we are all happy to welcome the

Every School Day Counts

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	Excellent
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Satisfactory
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Poor
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Very Poor
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Unacceptable
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and I Day of Learning Missed	Unacceptable

For some parents, 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half of a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year - that's nearly 4 school weeks.

Miss Logan then paid tribute to Mrs McAllister describing her as a well-respected member of the team who had displayed remarkable enthusiasm, devotion and commitment during the past 34 years when she had taught a range of classes from Primary 7 right down to Primary 1.

Head Girl and Head Boy (Amber Greer and Aaron Adair) then recited a poem entitled 'Why God Made Teachers' before a PowerPoint presentation displaying pictures of Mrs McAllister (drawn by each child in the school) was shown.

Rev. Dr N Cubitt (Chairperson of the Board of Governors) then formally thanked Mrs McAllister for her outstanding years of service to the school and on behalf of Governors wished her well in her years of retirement.

Teacher Miss Stephanie Fulton who had worked alongside Mrs McAllister for over 14 years described her as a committed, inventive and loving teacher who would without doubt be greatly missed at the school. Finally, Miss Marie Glass who had also worked very closely with Mrs McAllister for many years in the classroom spoke of her love and kindness not only towards her as a member of staff but also towards all the children who were in her care on a daily basis.

Mrs Lorraine Purcell then presented Mrs McAllister with a gift on behalf of the school's PTA before Amber (Head Girl) and Aaron (Head Boy) along with Leo and Sophia (Primary I pupils) presented her with a selection of gifts and cards from the pupils.

Following the presentations Mrs McAllister then spoke to thank all who had come along to this memorable assembly and to acknowledge all pupils and staff (past and present) who had supported her throughout her time at the school. She reminisced on her years at the school as being, 'the happiest days spent in a school which she described as being her family for the past 34 years'. She concluded by wishing the school, its staff and pupils, the very best in the years that lie ahead and hoped that the school would continue to go from strength to strength!'
