<u>Money Slips</u>

Admissions to Nursery & Primary School

If your child is starting preschool or primary school in September 2019, the closing date and time for pre-school and primary one applications will be 12.00 midnight tonight (Thursday 31 January 2019).



Pre-school places are available for children who are in the target age group, i.e. who were born on or between 2nd July 2015 and 1st July 2016.

All children born on or between 2nd July 2014 and 1st July 2015 must begin their primary education from September 2019 because by that date they will have reached COMPULSORY SCHOOL AGE.

Can I please remind you that if you have submitted an application and have not already done so, a copy of your child's birth certificate (and for Nursery Applications, a Benefit Verification form, if this is applicable to you), should be left into your first preference school office before 12:00noon on Friday 8th February 2019.
